The main tasks of the project and conferences are: 1) the unification of scientists, experts and practitioners engaged in research and practical regulation of migration in Russia and foreign countries; 2) expert evaluation and implementation of effective approaches and practices in migration management in the migration policy of Russia and partner countries; 3) development of an international research network of experts in the field of migration research; 4) activation of research activities of young scientists in the field of migration at the international level; 5) formation of a positive image of Russia as a country regulating migration on the basis of national legislation and interstate agreements.

The main issues proposed for discussion at the conferences are:

Within the framework of the international scientific and practical conference "Migration Bridges in Eurasia: Political, Socio-Economic, Demographic and Historical Perspectives for Northeast Asia" (Sendai, Japan), it is planned to hold sections on September 6-7, 2017:

- 1. Migrants and host communities in Northeast Asia.
- 2. The contribution of migration to the demographic and socio-economic development of Northeast Asia.
- 3. China's migration in Northeast Asia.
- 4. Migration, security and development in the border areas of Northeast Asia.

Working languages: Russian, Japanese, and English.

Within the framework of the IX International Scientific and Practical Forum "Migration Bridges in Eurasia: Models for the Effective Management of Migration in the Context of Developing a New Eurasian Integration Project" (Moscow, Russian Federation) it is planned to hold the following events on November 28-29, 2017,

1. Expert forum in the field of migration policy.

- Review of the migration situation in the Eurasian Economic Union and potential partners (presentations by experts from Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Armenia, Tajikistan and Vietnam).
- Experience in managing migration in foreign integration groups: LAIA, ASEAN, and NAFTA.

2. Thematic sections:

- Migration in the Russian Federation and foreign countries in the context of geopolitical, socio-economic and demographic transformations.
- Emigration and diaspora: channels of formation, development resources, state mechanisms of interaction.
- Labor migrants in the host countries: current issues of adaptation and legal status.
- Trends and prospects for the development of migration processes in the Eurasian Economic Union.

3. Discussion round tables.

Working languages: Russian and English; simultaneous translation is provided.

Organizational fee for participation in conferences is not charged.

It is planned to publish a special issue of the. Materials for publication are accepted <u>until</u> <u>September 17, 2017</u> (inclusive). Each author will receive a free copy of the collection.

Organizers do not pay travel and accommodation for participants of the conference.

Requirements to article

The text of the article is presented in Word format in Russian or English. The text is typed in Times New Roman font, size 14, line spacing 1.5, alignment in width. Indent of the first line is 1 cm.

The total volume of materials (including title, abstract, keywords, text, bibliography): up to 12 pages.

Pictures and schemes are performed <u>in black and white</u> and should be of good quality. Pictures should allow editing.

The text in the tables: the interval is single, size 12 TNR.

Examples of the design of tables and figures are given below.

References to sources in the text of the article are given in square brackets. References are made in accordance with GOST 7.1-2003. Sources are listed in alphabetical order. All sources from the list of literature should be referenced in the text.

Numbering of tables, figures, schemes, formulas is through.

The article <u>must include</u>: title, full names of authors, academic degree, position, place of work, e-mail address, abstract (5 - 7 lines), keywords (5-7 keywords or phrases), references and sources on <u>Russian and English</u>.


